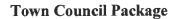

#### PRESENTATIONS TO MAYOR ROBY AND VICE-MAYOR SHERMAN

#### Comments from Mayor Roby:

It's been a pleasure to serve for the last 12 ½ years for the Town of Orange. It's a privilege to have the people that you live with elect you to take care of the needs of the town and to make sure that they have a good life and that the town does thrive. There are many things that I did not get done, wanted to get done, during my tenure on council and as Mayor, but I feel that I did make a difference. I have always felt that community service is an essential part of where you being where you live. You need to be a part of your community; you need to make sure that you understand what's in your community; and you need to make sure that you are a working part of that community to understand what it needs and to help it grow and sustain. So, thank you all very much for this time and I am hoping our next council will have as much success, and continue to support them, continue to have a voice, it is extremely important and they don't know what you need unless you tell them. So don't be afraid to do that. Thank you very much... I appreciate it.

# Town Council Meeting Minutes December 9, 2024 Page Two

Comments from Vice-Mayor Sherman:

29 years... that's a long time. 8 elections.

It seems like only yesterday, 1992, Bob Gillespie and I got elected and asked to serve. William Chewning was the mayor and that's when it all started. To me, it seems like yesterday.

When I look at my time, it's really two decades, 1992 -2008 we went through annexation. We didn't have really strong financial situation like we do now. We were putting in a wastewater treatment plant, and then 10 years later we were putting in another wastewater treatment plant and now we have the financial stress of two wastewater plants. I did remember when I was passing some pictures earlier, we had a drought in 2002 and the local people stepped up in town and said we got to have a good diversion barrier and we just did it thanks to Kendall Smith. We didn't really have a lot of back up then and we had to do something to get our water. We got it done and we survived. But then I was off for four years and Henry called me and said hey, would you consider coming back on with Martha. I said well, I didn't even sign up to run and Henry said Martha is running and we want you to throw your name in. So, I said well, ok. I got elected by write in that year. I got appointed, elected by write-in, so pretty happy about that. But everything was different then than it is now, let's put it that way. Our finances are straight, we got storage facility, we got back up generators, where we don't have to worry about the power going off, and thanks to Greg, we do have money to get things done. That's made a big, big difference. We got more reports than we need to read and so, and thankfully 2025 will be the two wastewater treatment plants paid for and that's major for the town. I thought we would never get through that debt but we did. So, thank you for that, Greg, thank you for stepping up. And Henry was right, it wasn't the same, it was a different situation. But I appreciate it and thank you for the proclamation - I'm not going to name anybody individually because you always leave someone out, but I have enjoyed the work that we've all put in so thank you.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Anna Bielecki appeared before Council regarding her wait for a 45-gallon trash container. The Town Manager stated that the smaller 45-gallon trash containers were still back-ordered, and she would get one when we received them. The Director of Public Works stated that the vendor currently had a new contract with New York City which was the reason for the backorder.

Ms. Bielecki also inquired about the Quiet Zone. The Town Manager stated that Town Council would start discussions and making decisions on their priorities at their first budget work session meeting in early February.

#### REPORTS

PRESENTATION OF FY24 AUDIT REPORT – MATTHEW MCLEAREN, CPA, CFE, MANAGING DIRECTOR – ROBINSON, FARMER, COX, ASSOCIATES, PLLC

Mr. Matthew McLearen, CPA, CFE, Managing Director – Robinson Farmer Cox, Associates, PLLC presented the Town's FY2024 Audit Report.

#### DIRECTOR OF FINANCE - FINANCE REPORT

The Director of Finance reported on the fifth month for FY25.

The Director of Finance reported that the General Fund Tax revenues were \$1.652M YTD and included one significant YTD favorable variance to budget and that was \$122K for Meals Tax. Total Tax revenue was \$114K favorable to budget.

The Director of Finance reported that in addition to the favorable tax revenue variances, interest income was \$47K favorable to the budget due to timing of ARPA Fund deposits.

The Director of Finance reported that General Fund Revenue was \$228K favorable to budget.

The Director of Finance reported that Water Sales Revenue YTD was \$849K and was \$148K favorable to the budget.

The Director of Finance reported that Sewer Sales Revenue YTD was \$1.137M and the revenue was \$92K in favor with the budget.

The Director of Finance reported that payments for the month were \$814K. The Director of Finance reported further that a \$325K payment was made to Virginia Resources Authority for the Wastewater Treatment plant loan, \$116K was paid to Dorsett Technologies for an upgrade to the Sewer Plant control panel, \$30K went to Rinker Designs for Sewer Line design and Crosswalk Analysis. The other payments are normal course of business experience.

The Director of Finance reported that expenditures from the \$8.0M ARPA funding (including VDH) were \$3.6M ITD, of which \$140K went toward engineering services and equipment for the Liquid Feed project at the Water Plant, \$231K went toward the new SCADA system for the Sewer Plant, \$238K was used for sewer system upgrades, \$123K paid for a dump truck, \$457 K had gone to Standpipe Engineering services, a new generator and land, \$107K had been used for the Macon Road Mixer, \$90K covered Water Line Engineering Services, \$452K had been spent on the Sewer Line Engineering services, \$87K covered an intake pump and pump repairs, and \$68K covered engineering services for the millimeter screen project. The Director of Finance reported that we had submitted \$1.562M to VDH for Standpipe Construction and have been reimbursed \$1.562M. The Director of Finance reported further that the Water Meter Replacement project is expected to be \$1.256M and the Standpipe Phase 2 project will be \$2.039M.

The Director of Finance reported that we have not received the monthly summary from the Virginia Investment Pool Monthly Report. The VIP Stable Value fund yield was 4.85% for November. The Town of Orange has \$979K invested in the fund. The VIP High Quality Bond fund yield was 4.20% for November. The Town of Orange has \$704K invested in the fund.

**SUBJECT:** Summary Financial Report – December 2024

The following is a summary report of the financial condition of the Town as of December 31, 2024, the sixth period of FY 2025 budget as approved and amended (amendments made in August 2024). The report covers 50% of the current fiscal year. Please review the attached schedules for specific category results.

#### **General Fund**

General Fund revenues year to date were \$3,507,619 or 45.64% of the FY 2024 annual budget. Referring to our annual projections spreadsheet (attached), the revenue position for the Net General Fund (excluding reserve usage) is \$288,018 higher than the budget.

Tax revenue for the month was \$442,154 of which 37% was derived from Meals Tax, 24% was received for Real Estate Tax and 15% was collected for Personal Property Tax.

Year to date Tax revenue was \$141,091 higher than budget.

Year to date Interest Income was \$50,379 favorable to budget due to timing of ARPA spending.

Year to date General Fund expenditures were \$3,564,789 or 46.38% of the amount budgeted for FY 2024. Expenditures are in line for this period considering the timing of the debt payments (\$156,689) and July donation payouts.

#### **Water Fund**

Water Fund revenues year to date were \$987,336 or 18.17% of the annual budget. Year to date revenue (excluding reserve usage) was \$162,827 higher than the budget driven by Water Sales, Water Availability Fees and Interest Income.

Year to date Water Fund expenditures of \$957,751 was 17.62% of the annual budget. Received VDH reimbursement of \$1,561,552 inception to date. Costs are in line with the budget for the period considering the timing of the debt payments (\$99,903). There are no outstanding VDH payments at this time.

#### **Waste Water Fund**

Sewer Fund Revenues year to date were \$1,300,989 or 43.46% of the annual budget. Year to date revenue (excluding reserve usage) was \$102,739 higher than budget driven by Sewer Sales, Sewer Availability Fees, Sludge and an increase in the Nutrient Credit Exchange payment. The favorable variances are partially offset by lower than budget Leachate Sales.

Year to date Sewer Fund expenditures of \$1,555,796 were 51.98% of the annual budget. Costs are in line for this period considering the timing of the debt payments (\$461,839) and payment for the dump truck (\$123,214).

#### **Cash Balances**

The combined cash balance for the Town's Funds as of December 31,2024 was \$8,017,970 with \$4,008,492 reserved for projects or dedicated to specific uses. The cash balance includes \$1,687,403 on deposit with the Virginia Investment Pool Trust Fund. Significant payments occurred in July for the US Bank loan and in November for the Virginia Resource Authority loan.

#### **Debt Balances**

A summary of the Town's Debt as of December 31,2024 is included with this report. The summary includes the significant debt payments and payoffs.

#### **ARPA Funds**

The Town of Orange ARPA Funds have been fully committed by the required deadline of December 31, 2024. Please review the detailed analysis included in this report.

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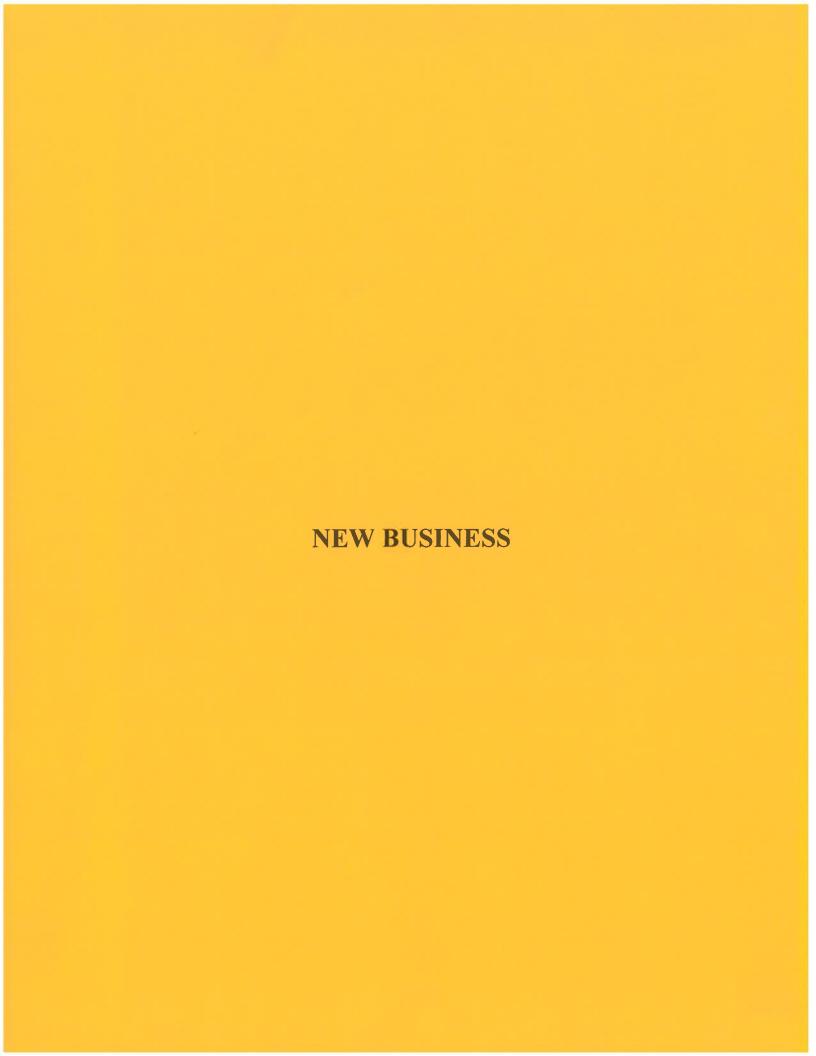
